The Intergenerational Center boasts educational, creative and social opportunities for all as well as a focus on health, welfare, values and community involvement. Coming soon, and of special interest, especially to the youth, is a Makerspace

equipped with a 3D printer and laser cutter. The Center is considered a "template" for the value of intergenerational involvement in the County and has already been the recipient of grants from the Board of Supervisors, the Department of Health and Human Services Aging Division and the EE Bettelheim Family Foundation. Dispose of your brush, branches, and dead vegetation. Bring them to:

WHERE: The gravel overflow parking lot on Redwood Highway (North of Nordstrom at The Village at Corte Madera)

WHEN: 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday and Sunday July 7 & 8, 2018

WHY: To provide a more "fire-safe" community.

This is also an opportunity to create a more Walk-Friendly Corte Madera & Larkspur by making our streets and sidewalks safer. Vegetation encroaching into sidewalks or limiting visibility from driveways is more than a nuisance, it's a hazard.

For the safety of our workers, some regulations:

- Collection is for "vegetation" waste only. No lumber, appliances, trash, metal objects, batteries, hazardous waste, etc. will be accepted.
- Stumps and poison oak will not be accepted.
- Any small plant material that has been pulled out by the roots must be free of rocks and dirt or it will not be accepted.
- No wire or metal of any kind may be mixed with the yard waste.
- Proof of Corte Madera or Larkspur residency is required.

Summer Playground Program

Summer Playground is a decades old summer program through Corte Madera Parks and Recreation. Campers are provided with a safe but exciting environment in which they are free to explore new activities, meet new friends and create life long memories. Employee or Independent Contractor? Use the ABC Test!

On April 30, 2018, the California Supreme Court issued a landmark decision in Dynamex Operations West, Inc. v. Superior Court, No. S222732, in which the court heightened the decadesold test for determining if a worker is an employee or an independent contractor, applying a more rigid, even more worker-friendly test.

Previously, the test used for classifying workers as employees or independent contractors considered multiple factors without a particular emphasis on, or requirement of, any one factor.

The new test makes it harder for companies to classify workers as independent contractors by requiring three factors to occur in conjunction as a threshold test for determining contractor status. Under the new test, the employer or "principal," as the hiring entity is called in relation to a contractor, now bears the burden of establishing all of the following "ABC" factors to prove the worker is an independent contractor and not an employee:

(a) that the worker is free from the control and direction of the hiring entity in connection with the performance of the work,

both under the contract and in fact: and

(b) that the worker performs work that is outside the usual course of the hiring entity's business; and

(c) that the worker is customarily engaged in an independently established trade, occupation, or business of the same nature as the work he or she performed for the principal.

An employer's failure to establish any of the three factors will result in a determination that the worker is an employee as a matter of law.

The Court's ruling specifically applies to claims asserted under the IWC Wage Orders, which impose obligations related to minimum wages, overtime, and required meal and rest breaks. It is unclear how the case applies to claims arising under other statutes.

What does this mean for employers?

With the constant influx of class action lawsuits regarding independent contractor status, companies doing business in California that treat some of its workers as independent contractors should immediately review those relationships under the ABC test. Moving forward, employers must use even more

scrutiny when examining their use of independent contractors, including any independent contractor agreements, to ensure compliance with the new standard. It also means that the vast majority of people working for a company will be considered employees if they perform work that is in the usual course of business of the company, even if those people clearly have their own business and act autonomously in their day-to-day duties. Therefore, employers should seriously reconsider classifying virtually all of their individual vendors as employees or at least realize the peril of penalties if they do not.
